Ramon Hamilton and Jennifer Fischer are busy these days. That's because when they're not planning for the Santa Clarita Valley Film Festival or shooting an independent film/feature they're leading hands-on film classes for youth and providing valuable resources to aspiring filmmakers in the region.

Just six months ago Ramon and Jennifer opened Santa Clarita's Film Center, available to students and independent filmmakers. The Center offers discounted rates on audition and rehearsal space, editing bays and even a fully equipped iMac with every filmmaking program imaginable that's available to rent for just \$15 per hour.

As part of the Center the pair started after-school and summer youth film and acting classes, which have become highly-sought after. Available to children ages 9-14, the classes provide hands-on education and experience in developing a film from start to finish, including work with professional programs and equipment, and acting for television, commercials and feature films.

"We've designed an innovative class structure that adjusts to the interests and age of our students. In all of our classes we work with our students to bring their ideas to life and to develop their craft," said Hamilton. "It's exciting to see their confidence grow through the programs."



"The Riches" pilot episode was shot in Louisiana, but the rest of the filming took place on two permanent sets at Santa Clarita Studios and on location in and around the Santa Clarita and San Fernando Valleys.

FILM OFFICE SEES RECORD NUMBERS IN FISCAL YEAR 2006-2007

To say that filming has increased in Santa Clarita this past Fiscal Year (FY runs from July – June) is an understatement. The City of Santa Clarita's Film Office posted the highest numbers since the Office's inception in 2002.

A comparison of the Film Office's performance over the last two years reveals a healthy 9 percent increase in the number of film permits issued within the City of Santa Clarita;

a **26 percent increase in film days** in the City; and a 47 percent increase in economic impact to the City of Santa Clarita and its businesses as a result of production spending while on location.

The Film Office is committed to keepi California's signature industry in the 30-mile zone and is working hard to ensure the continued growth of location filming in Santa Clarita and the film community.

City's Film Program Recognized as Best Economic Development Program in State

The Film Office was recognized by the California Association for Local Economic Development (CALED) as the "Best Economic Development Program" in the state. Santa Clarita's Film Office took top honors against several other economic development programs from cities like Long Beach, Vista, Fresno, Riverside, Selma and Santa Rosa.

Though the Santa Clarita Film Office is continuously recognized for its innovation, the CALED award is one of the most prestigious and celebrated to date because it recognized the important role the City's Film Office has played in helping to sustain and grow Santa Clarita's economy.

"Mike D. is out in the film community, keeping in touch and marketing his studio and Santa Clarita," said Lemchen. "He's a great resource and in Santa Clarita that worked well for us. He even got us a doctor at 8:00 p.m. one night."

Another strong selling point is the residents of Santa Clarita- the community is full of folks who understand and enjoy the industry. While "location burnout" has plagued many Southern California communities, Santa Clarita's residents and businesses continue to welcome production.

"We've never had a problem shooting on location," said Van Cott. "Everyone's been nice and people in Santa Clarita are more supportive overall of filming."

"For nearly a century Santa Clarita has been recognized as one of Hollywood's favorite locations and our Film Program is designed to retain the film industry already here, while attracting new productions and businesses," said City of Santa Clarita Mayor Marsha McLean.

"Over the last five years the City of Santa Clarita has taken a proactive approach to attracting and retaining film business, while providing programming that helps these companies succeed," commented McLean. "We've created a successful model that can be used by cities throughout the state to target key industry sectors, which is critical to our state's prosperity."

A good thing considering that the City's Film Office and businesses like Santa Clarita Studios, Valencia Studios and Santa Clarita Valley Locations have worked hard to attract the seven network shows that currently base in Santa Clarita. In addition to keeping local residents working close to home, these shows infuse millions of dollars each year into the local economy to Santa Clarita businesses, and the sales tax generated from this activity helps enable the City to pay for roads, parks, sheriffs and firemen.

"The City of Santa Clarita is committed to helping the industry thrive here," said City of Santa Clarita City Manager Ken Pulskamp. "We're in the 30-mile zone, offer a reverse commute from Los Angeles, the lowest permit fee in the area and we have locations that can be filmed to look like just about anywhere in the world.

It is possible to keep production here in Southern California, and in Santa Clarita we're working hard to do just that."

And so is Fox Television Studios, whenever possible.

"'The Riches' is an ambitious show, produced cost-effectively. That's a testament to writer/producer lain Patterson and the entire crew, for keeping the show running efficiently," commented Lemchen. "We need to be able to keep these shows in town and hopefully this will serve to help."
